## MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CAMERON COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 February 25, 2025

A meeting of the Board of Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 convened on February 25, 2025, at 8:00 a.m. at the office of the District pursuant to notice duly given as required by law. Present were Directors Steven Jennings, Jerome Wade and Nicholas Consiglio, General Manager Rolando Vela, Assistant General Manager Veronica Larraga, District Attorney Buddy R. Dossett, District Engineer Jack L. Brown, Special Projects Director Bryanna Woodman, and GIS Specialist Eloy Macias. Also in attendance was Alan Moore. President Jennings called the meeting to order and presided.

- Item 1 Pledge of Allegiance
- Item 2 Minutes. The Minutes of February 4, 2025, meeting were presented and reviewed. The motion was made by Jerome Wade seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that the Minutes of the February 4, 2025, meeting be approved. Following a discussion, the motion carried.

- Item 4 Subdivisions
  - 4.1 THE ROCKING "T" RANCH SUBDIVISION (12.46 acres of land out of Block 1, F.H. Handley Subdivision) Motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio to approve the preliminary plat. Following a discussion, the motion carried.
  - 4.2 KINGSWOOD SUBDIVISION (9.815 acres being out of Lot 17, Cunningham's Subdivision) Motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio to approve the preliminary plat. Following a discussion, the motion carried.

Following a discussion, the motion carried.

Following a discussion, the motion carried.

  - 6.1.1 Deliberations about Real Property Bus. 77/UPRR Crossing Improvements. 0.500 acres out of Block 61, David and Stephenson Subdivision. The Board did not go into closed session.
  - 6.1.2 Bus. 77/UPRR Crossing Improvements Purchase of Real Property being 0.500 acres out of Block 61, David and Stephenson Subdivision. No action was taken.
  - 6.2.1 Deliberations about Real Property Bus. 77/UPRR Crossing Improvements. A tract of land in Lot 1, Block 1, R A Billups Subdivision. The Board did not go into closed session.
  - 6.2.2 Bus. 77/UPRR Crossing Improvements Purchase of Real Property being a tract of land in Lot 1, Block 1, R A Billups Subdivision. No action was taken.
  - 6.3.1 Deliberations about Real Property Murphy/South Fork Detention. 1.00 acre out of Block 42, Wilson Tract Subdivision. The Board did not go into closed session.

  - 6.4.2 Combes Relief Drain Project–Purchase of Real Property being 17.0 acres, more or less, in the Cameron County School Land Block 14, David and Stephenson Subdivision. Consider, make decision, and take action on purchase of 17.0 acres, more or less, in the Cameron County School Land Block 14, David and Stephenson Subdivision.
    - (a) The motion was made by Nicholas Consiglio and seconded by Jerome Wade that the following findings and determinations be made:

Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 is a drainage district duly created, existing, and operating under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas, and owns, operates, and maintains drainage ditches designed and used for conveying stormwater run-off to the Arroyo Colorado, including the Wilson Tract Main Drain and the All-States Lateral.

The Board of Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 has

previously determined that there is a need for a new detention basin adjoining the Wilson Tract Main Drain and the All-States Lateral in Block 14, David and Stephenson Subdivision (Volume 1, Page 2, Map Records of Cameron County, Texas).

The Board of Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 hereby determines that there exists a necessity for said new detention basin adjoining the Wilson Tract Main Drain and the All-States Lateral in Block 14, David and Stephenson Subdivision, and determines that there is a necessity to acquire, by condemnation or otherwise, fee simple title to the land described as follows:

Being 17.0 acres, more or less (16.97 ac. calc.), out of the east 20.0 acres of **Block Fourteen (14)**, David and Stephenson Subdivision, Cameron County, Texas, according to the map or plat of said subdivision of record in Volume 1, Page 2, Map Records of Cameron County, Texas, to which map and its record reference is here made for all purposes, and being the east 20 acres of Block 14 save and except the east one hundred feet (100') thereof, more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

COMMENCING at the northeast corner of the David & Stephenson Subdivision, League 26, Cameron County School Land, Cameron County, Texas;

THENCE, along the east line of the David & Stephenson Subdivision, South  $00 \oplus 14'00''$  East, a distance of 2,640.0 feet to a point (being the southeast corner of Block 20);

THENCE, West along the north right-of-way of Kilbourn Avenue, at 8,024.4 feet passing the southeast corner of Block 14, a total distance of 8,124.4 feet to a concrete monument for the southeast corner of this tract;

THENCE, continuing along the north right-of-way of Kilbourn Avenue (a 30 foot County road) and the south line of Block 14, David & Stephenson Subdivision, West a distance of 560.0 feet a concrete monument for the southwest corner of this tract;

THENCE, North, at a distance of 1,288.0 feet a concrete monument, and at a distance of 1,320.0 feet a point in the north line of Block 14, and also being a point in the centerline of a canal;

THENCE, East along the north line of Block 14, and the center line of the canal, at a distance of 560.0 feet to a point for the west right-of-way of a canal and the northeast corner of this tract;

THENCE, South, at a distance of 48.0 feet a concrete monument and at a distance of 1,320.0 feet, the POINT OF BEGINNING, containing 17.0 acres, more or less;

being the same 17.0 acre tract described by metes and bounds description in the Deed from Joe Garrett and wife, Natalie Garrett to Veterans Land Board of Texas, dated October 15, 1962, recorded at Volume 736, Pages 215-217, Deed Records of Cameron County, Texas, and in the Contract of Sale between Veterans Land Board of Texas and Gilbert Lozano dated November 16, 1962, recorded at Volume 736, Pages 217-220, Deed Records of Cameron County, Texas, and in the Deed from the Estate of Gilbert Lozano, Deceased to Inecilia Lozano dated November 23, 2004, recorded Volume 10794, Pages 177-179, Official Records of Cameron County, Texas. Following a discussion, the motion unanimously carried.

(b) It was noted that the appraisal firm of Robinson, Duffy and Barnard, L.L.P. has determined the value of the property to be \$51,000.00. The motion was made by Nicholas Consiglio and seconded by Jerome Wade that the District's attorney be directed and authorized to submit an offer of \$51,000.00 to the owner as required by Texas Property Code \$21.0111(a), save and except oil, gas, and other minerals, but the owner shall have no rights of exploration or development on the property. Following a discussion, the motion unanimously carried.
