#### MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CAMERON COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 August 27, 2024

A meeting of the Board of Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 convened on August 27, 2024, at 8:00 a.m. at the office of the District pursuant to notice duly given as required by law. Present were Directors Steve Jennings, Jerome Wade and Nicholas Consiglio, General Manager Rolando Vela, Assistant General Manager Veronica Larraga, District Attorney Buddy R. Dossett, District Engineer Jack L. Brown, and GIS Specialist Eloy Macias. Also in attendance was Alan Moore. President Jennings called the meeting to order and presided.

- Item 1 Pledge of Allegiance
- Item 2 Minutes. The Minutes of the August 27, 2024, meeting were presented and reviewed. The motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that the Minutes of the August 27, 2024, meeting be approved. Following a discussion, the motion carried.
- Item 3 No one was present to discuss items not on the agenda.
- Item 4 Subdivisions.

HARLINGEN LAKES SUBDIVISION PHASE I & II (A 55.90 acre tract of land out of Survey 295, Stuart Place Subdivision) – Detention is proposed on a 10/50 year basis and is proposed to be accomplished by constructing three lakes within the development. Maintenance will be by a homeowners association. Discharge from the detention basins will be directed to the Stuart Place Main Drain by way of a storm sewer. A license agreement for the discharge pipe into the drain will be required. Water and sanitary sewer is to be provided by the Harlingen Waterworks System. Motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio to approve the preliminary plat. Following a discussion, the motion passed.

**LIBERTY SUBDIVISION LOT 1 REPLAT** (Being 61.26 acres of land and being a replat of Lot 1, Block 1 Liberty Subdivision) — Water and sanitary sewer will be provided by the Harlingen Waterworks System. An additional 30' of property was granted to accommodate the widening of the existing drain along the west and south side of the proposed lot. Motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio to table this plat. The original was not present. Following a discussion, the motion passed.

SAN MARCOS SUBDIVISION NO. 3 (A 19.00 acre tract of land being a part of portion out of Block 29, Wilson Tract Subdivision) – Detention is proposed on a 10/50 year basis and is proposed to be accomplished by widening the lateral drain along the north property line and constructing an interior drainage swale and detention within a publicly dedicated 20 and 40 foot easement. A license agreement for the discharge pipe into the drain will be required. Water and sanitary sewer is assumed to be provided by the City of Combes. At the District's meeting on August 13, 2024, the Board agreed to assist in the oversizing of the proposed culvert under Cragon Road from an existing 24" to a 48" culvert. Motion was made by Nicholas Consiglio, seconded by Jerome Wade to deny this plat. Following a discussion, the motion was passed.

**LOT 5A AND LOT 11A, BLOCK 14, RE-PLAT OF LOTS 5, 6, 11 AND 12, BLOCK 14 TOWNSITE OF PRIMERA** (Being 0.15 acres of land, more or less, consisting of all of lots 5 and 6, Block 14, Townsite of Primera; and being 0.15 acres of land, more or less, consisting of all of Lots 11, and 12, Block 14, Townsite of Primera) — Motion was made by Nicholas Consiglio, seconded by Jerome Wade to approve and sign this subdivision plat. Following a discussion, the motion passed.

#### Item 5 Budget and Total Tax Rate

- 5.1 A Public Hearing was held concerning the proposed tax rate for the tax year 2024. The required notice was published in the Valley Morning Star on Saturday, August 17, 2024, for the required period of time.
- 5.2 Manager Vela presented the proposed budget for the Construction and Maintenance Fund and the Interest and Sinking Fund. After discussion, motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio to adopt the budgets. Following a discussion, the motion carried. The budgets adopted area as follows:
