MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CAMERON COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 5 April 23, 2024

A meeting of the Board of Directors of Cameron County Drainage District No. 5 convened on April 23, 2024, at 8:00 a.m. at the office of the District pursuant to notice duly given as required by law. Present were Directors Steve Jennings, Jerome Wade and Nicholas Consiglio, General Manager Rolando Vela, Assistant General Manager Veronica Larraga, District Engineer Jack L. Brown, and GIS Specialist Eloy Macias. Also in attendance were Alan Moore and Dustin Moore. President Jennings called the meeting to order and presided.

- Item 1 Pledge of Allegiance
- Item 2 Minutes. The Minutes of the April 9, 2024 meeting were presented and reviewed. The motion was made by Jerome Wade, seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that the Minutes of the April 9, 2024 meeting be tabled, pending review by District Attorney Dossett. Following a discussion, the motion carried.
- Item 3 No one was present to discuss items not on the agenda.
- Item 4 Subdivisions.
 - 4.1 EL DORADO SUBDIVISION (5.255 acre tract out of 10.51 acre tract out of Block 34, Wilson Tract Subdivision) Final plat not presented. The motion was made by Jerome Wade and seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that the plat be denied. Following a discussion, the motion carried.
 - 4.2 PALOMA ESTATES SUBDIVISION (6.27 acres of land out of Block 15, Leeland Subdivision of Section s 297 and 42) - This development is adjacent to the District's Stuart Place Main Drain on the south and west perimeter. Detention is proposed to the City of Harlingen standards (10/50) and will be privately maintained. Accordingly, a down drain license will be required. The motion was made by Jerome Wade and seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that this plat be given preliminary approval subject to the down drain license being finalized
 - 4.3 GARRETT ACRES ESTATES (15.24 ACRES OUT OF BLOCK 36 OF THE STUART PLACE SUBDIVISION OF SURVEY 298) – The development will provide storm water detention to the requirements of the City of Harlingen by widening the south side of the existing District drain along the north side of the property. These improvements will be within a 60 foot right of way to be dedicated to the District. A down drain license will be required. The motion was made by Jerome Wade and seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that this plat be given preliminary approval subject to the down drain license being finalized
 - 4.4 TRES CAMINOS SUBDIVISION (19.28 acres of land out of Blocks 11, 12, 13 & 14, Survey 295, Stuart Place Subdivision) This development will provide storm water detention to the requirements of Cameron County and

the City of Harlingen by widening the north side of the Hensz Lateral which is at the south limits of the property. The widening of the ditch has not been inspected by staff at this time. The motion was made by Jerome Wade, and seconded by Nicholas Consiglio that the plat be tabled. Following a discussion, the motion carried.

Item 5 TexPool. Update bank information at TexPool 5.1. The motion was made by Nicholas Consiglio and seconded by Jerome Wade to approve the following:

As we prepare for hurricane season, he suggested we contact City of Palm Valley in hopes that they work with their contractor to ensure that these improvements on the south end of the project be made in a timely manner.
